Contributions or gifts to Josh Welle for Congress are not tax-deductible. Federal law requires us to use our best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation, and name of employer of individuals who contribute in excess of \$200 in an election cycle. Federal law requires that only personal funds or funds from federally registered Political Action Committees (PACs) can be accepted. Corporate checks or funds, funds from foreign nationals, and contributions made in the name of another cannot be accepted. Contributions cannot be made from the treasury of an entity or person who is a federal contractor. Contributions from employees of a federal contractor are acceptable. Individuals may contribute up to \$2,700 per election (\$5,400 for the cycle) and multi-candidate Political Action Committees may contribute up to \$5,000 per election (\$10,000 per cycle). **Josh Welle** is a U.S. Navy veteran, entrepreneur and Democratic candidate for New Jersey's Fourth Congressional District.

Born and raised in Monmouth County, New Jersey, Josh graduated from Wall Township High School in 1997 and was then appointed to the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, graduating in 2002. Following commissioning, he served 12 years with missions to Iraq and Afghanistan. He also served overseas deployments in Africa, Asia and Europe for anti-piracy, counterterrorism and global peacekeeping operations. In 2015, after earning the rank of Commander, Josh transitioned to the U.S. Navy Reserve.

He founded a software company focused on developing mobile solutions for the Department of Defense and other large enterprises. Josh has earned three Master's degrees: in Public Administration from Harvard University and Business Administration and International Relations from University of Maryland, College Park.

Ready to serve his country out of uniform, Josh announced his candidacy to represent his home, New Jersey's Fourth District, in the U.S. Congress.
